5. To **preserve the lighthouse shore station** at Hynish, and other features of historic, prehistoric and/or architectural significance in the vicinity.
6. To **increase public knowledge and awareness** of the historic lighthouse shore station at Hynish as well as Skerryvore lighthouse and other relevant topics.
