



Aim and Purpose of the S3 Geography Students' Place-Based Assessments


Aim

The place-based assessments aimed to highlight what S3 Geography students think is good about the places they live and what they would like to see improved.

The students used the Place Standard Tool to carry out their assessments.

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What is the Place Standard Tool?

The Place Standard tool is a way of assessing places. It provides a simple framework to structure conversations about place, based around 14 questions.

It allows you to think about the physical elements of a place (such as the buildings, spaces, and transport) as well as the social aspects (like whether people feel they have a say in decision making).

The tool provides prompts for discussions, allowing you to consider all the elements of a place in a methodical way.

Purpose

These assessments were carried out as part of the Aspiring Places – Community Projects in Argyll and Bute initiative.

It's important to include young people's voices in community projects.

We'll share the results on the Aspiring Places website to help decision-makers understand more about young people's views on the places where they live and go to school.






What did the geography students in Tobermory get up to?

What's good now?

"community

and **nature**"

"In Tobermory we have many **community** events and clubs. There is also Aros Park, which is a well looked after natural space. We have a football pitch, tennis court, and also park. On the main street we have mainly clear paths and pavements, there are also many disabled parking spots"

"there is **friendly neighbors**, **safe at night**, it's **welcoming** for people to come in and **transport service easy to use**"

"quiet and small and local area with lots of shops, lots of parking spots and there is a corner shop and primary/ high school" "lots of shops and places to eat and nice community and lots of clubs and sports to attend"

"Mull is a **safe and friendly place** that has services and facilities we need such as **shops**, **high school & primary, dentist, doctors all very close by**. There is a lot of **tourism and kind locals**, the **streets are pretty well maintained**"

"free **parking**, residents parking, **natural spaces**, the **sports pitch**, the new **public toilet**. Quite a few **businesses** letting kids work, **church**, **ceilidhs**, **parties** at the village hall often, **friendly** community. **Safe** at day and night"

"we need more **public transport** like buses on weekend. During summer (music festival) there is almost no **parking** on main street. Motorhomes/ campervans very often park overnight on main street although they're not allowed which is a problem. We also need a **gym, more facilities, youth clubs**. Its hard to get a **driving test**"

"more people my age, more shops and services, nearby education, and a place to do activities with a pitch and basketball court"

"more social buildings, public bus service at the weekends. Better pavements, play equipment, more bins placed around, the primary school education. Driving tests could be more accessible. Better places like gyms and social buildings. Better street lights. cheaper, more shops, less second homes that hardly get used"

What could be improved?

"cheaper shops, more shops, more activities, school bus instead of public one, sports shops, clothes shops"

"There could be a **bigger** community of people with different perspectives and views. We could get potholes in roads filled in and lines on roads repainted, we could also fix up pavements"

> "Needs a better **water defense**. Water can come in and cant get out. **Repaint roads and a bigger co-op**"

"better **care** for some places and **more clubs and shops** open in winter"

Tobermory High School

What's good now?

"there's loads of nice **local events** around Tobermory and the rest of the island like the panto, the Christmas lights switch on, the music festival, bonfire night etc. I especially like the panto personally, it is really nice to see the locals who come together to do these kind of things and makes me feel good that I live here"

> "Safe, social and welcoming and is easy to get around, pretty **clean** as well"

"Not many people live there and also it is very central to the shop and church"

"Places to eat like the Mangochans and the Wester Isles Hotel"

"it's a great **community** like the community events such as light switch on and music festival. There is lots of **parking**, lots of businesses and quite a bit of forestry"

"the **people** and the **community** are good, the roads and moving around are quite good too. For example, plenty **paths** to walk around Tobermory.

"Fill in **potholes**. Tourists stop camping in car park which happens even though there are signs to stop this. Need more **buses**, no buses to certain places on weekends"

"more street furniture, another place for social events, maybe more **sports** or equipment and more jobs probably"

"street lights and a football pitch for young kids"

What could be improved?

"fix **roads** and pavements because they are all broken such as Rockfield Road and River side"

"hotels are needed and the public transport isn't great. We need more **buses**. For examples there's not enough buses just to get to Oban and back without a very long wait"

"there is a big problem around **housing** where many new people moving to the island have no where to stay because a lot of the houses that are there are either holiday houses or way too expensive, so more houses that aren't really expensive would be nice. Also during big tourist season the parking gets really stuffed up with their vehicles (sometimes in really weird spots). So parking regulations and more spots would help"


