# SOME BRIEF NOTES ON WHO PRINCESS LOUISE WAS...

Louise, daughter of Queen Victoria, lived at Rosneath Castle as she loved the beauty and quietness of the Gareloch. In her later years, the area was to provide a haven for her.

This talented woman was both intelligent beautiful and artistic. Her dissatisfaction with the royal court led her to pursue sculpture and painting. It was said of her that she could "draw beautifully" and also that she was an able dancer. However, because of her royal rank, an artistic career was out of the question. Nonetheless in 1863 the Queen allowed her to attend art school. Later Louise was also to become a supporter of the women's suffrage movement.

**Although of independent mind,** she was gentle and unaffected. She mingled freely with people and had very democratic views about human relations. 'The less fortunate' were always her concern.

**In Rosneath she was Patron** of St Modan's Parish Church, which she

attended regularly, contributing to the church organ fund, the building fund for the vestry, and to the installation of electric lighting to the church and manse. Appointed as the first royal patron of the Girl Guides, she expressed a desire that the Dunbartonshire Girl Guides should be called Princess Louise's Own, a royal accolade they have been proud to bear ever since.

Louise was President of Rosneath District Nurses Association and a great supporter of Erskine Hospital for disabled servicemen which she formally opened in June 1917. She visited it every year until she too frail to do so.


During WW2 Rosneath castle - now demolished - was an HQ for the Rosneath Naval Base. In 1942 Churchill, Eisenhower and Montgomery planned Operation Torch, the successful invasion of French North Africa, within its walls.

We are still researching how this community building came to be named for this extraordinary woman and doubtless, some local knowledge out there will supply answers and more.


